Motion Lawson 2nd Stein to approve the consent agenda.

DEPARTMENT HEADS & COMMITTEES:

1. Engineer, Jeremy Schwarze

- Pay Request No. 1 Public Works Garage \$185,949.20.
 Motion Lawson 2nd Guyer. All in favor.
- b. Pay Request No. 1 Concrete Construction project \$40,299.00. No action taken.
- c. Alley Cost Estimate –Schwarze provided Council with estimates and explained that the green space estimate and alley reconstruction estimate are comparable in price. Utility costs could be covered with a grant. This will be discussed further at the workshop.
- d. Recent Concrete work- Lawson stated he is disappointed in the outcome of the sidewalk by the fire department. Others agreed.
 Schwarze will contact the contractor and request it be corrected to city specs. The bus garage entrance concrete looks good.
- e. Public Works Garage electrical upgrade to a 200-amp service at an additional cost of approximately \$4,160.00. Motion Stein 2nd Lawson. All in favor.

2. Police, Chief Sam Hussman

- a. Transcriptionist position. Motion Trboyevich 2nd Lawson to abolish the transcription position. All in favor.
- b. Accident- Council was provided with two quotes to repair the 2022 Ford Expedition squad car that was damaged due to a collision with a deer. Repairs will be paid for by the League of Minnesota Cities Insurance. M&M Auto Body can begin repair immediately. Motion Lawson 2nd Guyer to approve the squad car be repaired by M&M Auto Body. All in favor.

- 3. Public Works, Kevin Odden
 - a. June Report-informational
 - b. Red Rock water leak- Odden advised that Casper Construction dug up where the sleeve was put on in April and water was leaking from another spot. A rock caused the problem.
 - c. EPA email- Odden requested Attorney Dimich review legal documents and is awaiting his response.
 - d. Restricting Main Street parking 2nd 5th Avenues & reducing Main Street speed limit. The County Commissioner approved restricting parking but the city needs to pass a resolution. Odden will check on possible Main Street speed limit reduction before a resolution is presented to Council. Some residents in attendance voiced their opposition to a speed limit reduction.
 - e. Motion Guyer 2nd Lawson to approve RC Seal Coating's change order of \$29,300 for asphalt repair with a city crew doing the removal. All in favor.
 - f. Nugent Concrete sidewalk sections quote: Motion Guyer 2nd Meyer to approve Nugent Concrete's quote of \$5,000 for sidewalk sections which the County will reimburse. All in favor.
 - g. Nugent Concrete estimate of \$7,750 for Fire Hall concrete repair-Odden will contact Schwartz about damage incurred while Schwartz performed work for KMDA in approximately 2016 and will update Council at the workshop.
